Hello everyone,

I'm Joe Glaze, site manager for the Cardinal Point Wind facility and I'm happy to be reaching out to the community. I am responsible for the facility's overall operations and maintenance and working in cooperation with the 135 landowners involved in the project. Cardinal Point Wind spans 20,000 acres and includes 46 wind turbines located in McDonough County and 14 in Warren County.

It's hard to believe that the facility has been operational for 4 years now! It was March of 2020 when the 150-megawatt (MW) project started producing power. Since operations began, the Cardinal Point team has focused on establishing a record of safe and reliable operation, which is a priority for Capital Power. We continue to complete regular inspections of the facility's 180 blades with regular maintenance activities generally taking place in the Spring and Fall.

We have an established community investment program, which I am proud to say has been at work in the local area. In 2023, we launched our Community Sustainability Fund offering grants of up to \$20,000. See page 2 for more information on last year's local recipient and how you can apply for the 2024 grant.

I've lived just outside of Macomb, for 5 years now and my wife and I continue to enjoy being a part of the community. Our family continues to visit different parks in the area and attend the many local events. If you see us out and about, be sure to say hi!

Know what's below. Call before you dig.

It's everyone's responsibility to know where the lines are before you dig. Keep yourself and those around you safe by always contacting 811 before you dig. Underground utility services such as electricity wires and natural gas lines present significant hazards if struck.

At Cardinal Point there are approximately 38 miles of underground high-voltage collector lines that tie the facility's six circuits to the substation. While the collector lines are buried to a depth of at least five feet it's always a good idea to call 811 at least two business days before planning any type of excavation to identify the location of buried infrastructure to prevent potential line strikes. 811 is a national number that connects to an organization called JULIE in Illinois, which is available free of charge.
